I have been serving in ministry since 2009. I began in youth ministry and spent eight years as a youth pastor before stepping into the role of senior pastor in 2018. Throughout these years, God has opened incredible doors internationally, especially in Poland, where I have now served 16 times over the past 12 years.

What began as serving in children's and youth camps and preaching in local churches has grown into a deep and ongoing partnership with leaders across the nation. Over the years, I have ministered in more than 20 cities throughout Poland, preached in churches, spoken at pastor conferences, and led two youth camps.

Along the way, I have witnessed the faithfulness and power of God in extraordinary ways. I have seen salvations, lives restored, and supernatural healings. One of the most remarkable moments was seeing a teenager receive a new heart, later confirmed by doctors after prayer. I also witnessed a pastor who had been diagnosed with stage 4 stomach cancer completely healed after we prayed for him during a conference. These moments are humbling reminders that the Gospel is not only proclaimed, it is demonstrated.

Beyond events and services, one of the greatest gifts has been relationship. Over the years, I have built connections with leaders from more than 50 churches and continue to work closely with pastors and leadership teams throughout Poland. These relationships have become long term partnerships centered on strengthening the Church and reaching people far from Christ.

On this upcoming trip, the ministry is expanding into five new churches. My focus will be equipping pastors and leadership teams to become the encounter of God's love, grace, and mercy to people far from Him. The heart behind every trip is not just events but empowerment, not just inspiration but transformation that lasts.
